Our Mission

The Liberty Hill Improvement Council created an Education Endowment Fund established with a mission to increase the literacy rate of students reading below their grade level in the Liberty Hill Community.

In order to ensure success, an afterschool literacy program has been implemented in conjunction with Hursey Elementary School K-5.

Eligibility to participate in the program will be confined to those students identified as reading below grade level that reside in the Liberty Hill Community.

The Program's Motto is ***"I Believe in Myself and My Ability to do My Best."*** By creating this structured program for the children of the community, we are ensuring that our young people are learning to read early so that they will be able to read to learn later in life. A true investment in the community's future...***The Children.***

What We Do

The Education Endowment Fund was established to assist the Charleston County School District with its goal of eradicating illiteracy among students that attend public schools in Charleston County.

We will accomplish this goal by working with the elementary schools to ensure that we are reinforcing methods and instructions that are being taught during the school day with those students enrolled in the Liberty Hill Improvement Council Afterschool Literacy Program.



Our Story

The LHIC Afterschool Literacy Program has been created to improve the reading levels of those elementary students (K-5) that reside in the Liberty Hill Community. We will accomplish this goal by creating a program that will reinforce the skills and training that the students receive during the regular school hours. We believe this approach will benefit the students, the parents and the teachers.

The LHIC Afterschool Literacy Program will operate Monday through Thursday from 3:00 PM to 6:00 PM. We will provide transportation for students attending Hursey Elementary to the Felix Pinckney Community Center. Students attending other schools will use regular bus transportation. During the three hour period each afternoon, students will be given the instruction and guidance needed to improve their reading and math skills. A healthy snack will also be provided.

Each student's reading level will be documented at the beginning of the program and assessed periodically throughout the program and presented to the parents along with recommendations for parental involvement to ensure that each student is making the expected improvements. The LHIC is committed to helping bridge the gap between the teachers and the parents.

The LHIC Afterschool Literacy Program will utilize the same materials and programs that are being utilize at school. The purpose is to reinforce those efforts being taught at the school and not to give the students additional methodology thereby confusing the student and the parent.
